## Dimensionalizing Cultures: The Hofstede Model in Context

British anthropologist Mary Douglas (1973) proposed a two-dimensional ordering of ways of looking at the world: 1. 'Group' or inclusion - the claim of groups over members, and 2. 'Grid' or classification - the degree to which interaction is subject to rules. Douglas saw these categories as relating to a wide variety of beliefs and social actions:
